Home to Hood County Judge George Tarrant, who also served as chairman of the Hood County school district. Tarrant was an 1893 graduate of Granbury College, a local public school teacher and a farmer.

Frame construction, asbestos siding, fish-scale shingles in front gable

Gable roof, composition shingles

One exterior stone chimney

Double-hung, wood windows

One single-door primary entrance with transom, old Victorian-style door

One story, 1,380 square feet

Large lot, two barns reflecting early agricultural use, large trees, old wire fence and gate with old plate, "Texas Wire Fence Company, Denton, Texas"
